Crime Stoppers--Guest presenter Christa Campbell

Crime Stoppers is a non-profit organization helping to take a bite out of crime. Christa Campbell is here to talk about the relationship with KAFM and Crime Stoppers.

Crime Stoppers has a 15 minute segment each month focusing on safety: police, fire, overview of Crime Stoppers, elder abuse, auto theft, animal cruelty

Shows typically correspond with timely topics each month.
